2008-present Woodrow Wilson Instructor

This unique program attracts committed individuals who have a background in the STEM fields- science, technology, engineering, and mathematics- into teaching in high-need secondary schools in Indiana. Our fellows are placed in Muncie and Anderson high schools. We have developed an integrated curriculum in collaboration with faculty from the college of Sciences and Humanities (with Teachers College). During the summer, faculty provide an intense program on content and pedagogy. During the school year, instruction is done at the school sites (Muncie central, Muncie Southside, Anderson, and Highland). Fellows benefit from being immersed in the school setting and having faculty provide on site instruction where they address any issues arising from interaction with students and faculty/personnel at the school.

The program is based on the collaboration of the following departments: Elementary Education, Educational Studies and Educational Psychology to provide this immersive experience. Early childhood and elementary education majors spend a full semester immersed in the Whitely community – interacting with community leaders, agencies, schools, and educational programs – in order to learn about the community from which the children come. Students benefit from this semester-long experience by gaining a better understanding of the impact of community and family contexts in the educational process. They also provide a benefit to the community by participating in a project that meets a community need. This experience provides students and faculty with the opportunity to participate in teaching, research, and service in the community.

MAJOR PROJECTS

2009 *Dream Course Instructor*

This course (Child Development: A Multicultural Approach) was a outcome of my Teaching Excellence Award. The course explored the impact of culture on child development, with an emphasis on 4 special topics: child rearing practices, adolescence rites of passage, adolescent popularity and bullying, organized sports and academic achievement. There was a critical analysis of current research, including interaction with guest speakers from diverse cultures to enhance awareness and understanding of the impact of different cultural contexts on child development. Guest speakers from these countries visited our class: Congo, Kenya, Benin, Costa Rica, Poland, Argentina, Brazil, India, Ice land, China, Malaysia, Singapore, and Japan! Students also visited local middle schools to talk with students about popularity and bullying.
