Spring 2025 Fraternity & Sorority Life Report Executive Summary

Academics

- The Spring 2025 All-Greek GPA of 3.193 is higher than the All-BSU average of 3.020.
- The following chapters achieved the highest GPA for their respective council: Delta Chi (Interfraternity Council), Alpha Phi Alpha (National Pan-Hellenic Council), and Chi Omega (Panhellenic Association).

Housing

- Members of Delta Tau Delta, Phi Sigma Kappa, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Sigma Chi, Sigma Nu and Sigma Phi Epsilon live in houses privately owned or leased by their respective housing corporations.
- Alpha Tau Omega, Sigma Nu and Sigma Phi Epsilon are alcohol-free facilities.

Leadership Development

- More than 500 FSL Leaders participated in our Event Monitor Training that focuses on Alcohol Awareness, Conflict Management, and Risk Management throughout the academic year.
- Our Greek Honor Society, Order of Omega, initiated 19 new members to the chapter this semester. They will help facilitate and plan Greek Week for the community.
- In December, our Interfraternity Council Executive Board attended both the IFC Academy & IFC Prime to jump start the education process of their roles, and how to better improve their community.
- In January, the Panhellenic Association traveled to Plainfield, Indiana to attend the Panhellenic Academy where they will be able to network with other institutions and learn more about their positions.

Recruitment, Retention & Expansion

- The Greek community totaled 1,194 members during the Spring 2025 semester, down from 1,230 members in Spring 2024. This is a **2.92% decrease** of members.
- Currently 11.04% of Ball State students are members of a fraternity or sorority.
- Four of the seven NPHC fraternities and sororities brought in 11 new members this Spring, compared to 15 new members the previous Spring.
- This semester, IFC revisited expansion and has decided to invite Pi Kappa Alpha (PIKE) to campus this upcoming Fall semester.
- The 12 IFC fraternities welcomed 67 new members this Spring. This number is a **55.81% increase** from the Spring 2024 semester with 43 new members joining all 11 chapters.
- The 10 Panhellenic sororities welcomed 57 new members this Spring. This number is a **3.63% increase** from the Spring 2024 semester with 55 new members joining all 10 chapters.
- The Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life welcomed our first Cultural Greek Council (CGC) chapter to our campus, Alpha Pi Sigma, who received their charter this past March. They welcomed 9 new members this Spring.

Service & Philanthropy

- During the Spring 2025 semester, 4,327.19 hours of hands-on community service hours were completed by fraternity and sorority members. This number is a **8.93%** increase from the 3,972.19 hours performed in the Spring 2024 semester.
- During the Spring 2025 semester, \$66,706.90 was raised for charities by fraternities and sororities. This is a **112.44% increase** from \$31,399.25 during the Spring 2024 semester.
