### Jeff Seidel Detriot Free Press

The National Journalism Writing Award recognizes excellence in storytelling. The focus of this award is on outstanding writing, a skill critical to informing and connecting people across the globe.

Jeff Seidel has spent more than 27 years at the Detroit Free Press, building a body of work defined by his narrative reporting and an ability to find the human heart of complex stories. Seidel specializes in immersive human-interest journalism, often spending months or even a year following subjects to tell full, nuanced stories that challenge easy answers and honor lived experience.

His multi-year reporting on Amedy Dewey, an individual who survived an act of violence that transformed her life, exemplifies this approach. Seidel's coverage moves beyond the event itself to trace recovery, the often-fractured path of healing and the quiet resilience of people rebuilding their lives. Those stories model journalism's capacity not just to inform, but to deepen public understanding and restore dignity to those whose lives become public narratives.

Alongside his features, Seidel has produced sports coverage and major-event reporting, including assignments at three Olympic Games. His work has been recognized with prestigious honors, including a National Headliner Award, three Livingston Award finalist nods, and four Associated Press Sports Editors (APSE) awards, placing him among the nation's top writers in both feature and column categories. Across every beat, Seidel's prose is notable for its clarity, compassion and craft.



## Navbahor Imamova

Voice of America

Navbahor Imamova is a leading journalist on Central Asian geopolitics and development whose reporting has connected audiences in information-scarce regions with authoritative, on-the-ground coverage for more than two decades. A Ball State graduate (M.A. '03), Imamova helped launch Voice of America's (VOA) Uzbek television programming in 2003 and has since anchored, produced, and reported editions of the weekly program Amerika Manzaralari, over a thousand episodes that blend news, analysis, and service journalism for Uzbek-speaking audiences.

Imamova's work stands out for its mix of regional expertise and groundbreaking access. She is the first and only U.S. journalist accredited to report from inside Uzbekistan, offering firsthand coverage of political transitions, social change and daily life in a country otherwise closed to outside media. Her reporting has revealed the complexities of human experience across Central Asia, translating those dynamics for U.S. and international audiences.

Driven by her belief in journalism as a public service, Imamova uses VOA and other platforms to bridge the gap between policy and people, making geopolitical shifts understandable and personal stories visible. Her work has earned her recognition as a leading voice both inside the region and in global discussions about Central Asia's present and future.




SJSC Hall of Fame Award **Quinn Klinefelter** *Detroit Public Radio* 

Quinn Klinefelter is a seasoned radio journalist and editor whose reporting and anchoring have shaped civic conversation across Detroit and beyond. A Ball State alumnus ('86) who earned an M.A. from the University of Missouri, Columbia, Klinefelter brings nearly three decades of experience to his role as host and Senior News Editor at 101.9 WDET. He anchors midday newscasts and prepares reports heard on WDET as well as partner outlets, including NPR and the BBC.

Klinefelter's journalism centers on government and politics, and his reporting has included interviews with numerous presidential candidates, multiple Michigan governors and every Detroit mayor elected in the 21st century. That depth of access reflects both his institutional knowledge of Michigan politics and a reputation for fair, rigorous questioning.

His work has earned more than fifty awards from organizations such as CBS Radio, the Associated Press, the Wisconsin Broadcast Association, the Michigan Association of Broadcasters, and the Society of Professional Journalists, a testimony to his range and sustained excellence across beats and formats. Whether anchoring a midday newscast, producing an investigative segment, or crafting a field report, Klinefelter combines clarity, context, and a steady newsroom ethic that informs listeners and strengthens public discourse.
