The MUD Program is a hands-on program in the theory and practice of public-focused, interdisciplinary design for cities, towns, neighborhoods, and places. This program is centered on design for, and of the public, striving for positive connections, experiences, and identity through public places. Our work integrates the various interconnected yet disparate elements of people, communities, policies, plans, landscapes, buildings, streets, and in-between spaces. This happens across a spectrum of scales from the experience of human interaction on the block, within the neighborhood, across the city, and beyond to the region as we facilitate connections between people and spaces in developing place-based outcomes.

The Indianapolis-based MUD Program exemplifies Ball State University's commitment to immersive and hands-on learning. All students participate in a studio-based and community-based curriculum taught by an interdisciplinary team of instructors from the many professional firms within the City and as well as the College of Architecture and Planning.

While the majority of our students come from design-based backgrounds such as architecture, and urban planning, we accept a limited number of students with other educational and professional experiences with such decisions being made on a case-by-case basis.

With classes held on Tuesdays and Thursdays, the program is designed to let students maintain professional work commitments throughout the rest of the week.
