Jared Hauser bio:

Described by *ArtsNash* as "melodious and spontaneous," and praised by *Gramophone* as a "sensitive, elegant soloist" with a "subtle refined style," oboist Jared Hauser is known for his stylistic fluency and exploration of new musical territory. He has built a dynamic career that bridges musical eras, genres, and traditions.

Hauser serves as Associate Professor of Oboe at Vanderbilt University's Blair School of Music while maintaining an active performance and recording schedule. He also serves on the faculty of the National Music Festival and Mostly Modern Festival.

Hauser performs as principal oboe of the Nashville Opera Orchestra, with the Blair Woodwind Quintet, the Montrose Duo, Intersection, and on historical instruments with Music City Baroque. Recent performing collaborations have taken him to venues across North America, Brazil, Germany, France, Italy, and Costa Rica. As orchestral musician, he has performed with the symphony orchestras of Detroit, Atlanta, Houston, Nashville, and the Orchestra Camerata Ducale (Turin), and served as principal oboe of the Orlando Philharmonic Orchestra.

A champion of new and innovative music, Hauser has over 50 world premieres to his credit including works by Augusta Read Thomas, Libby Larsen, Lowell Liebermann, Peter Schickele, Ellen Taaffe Zwilich, John Harbison, and Nailah Nombeko among others. His discography includes nearly 20 solo and chamber albums with BGR and Naxos, and can also be heard on recordings with Koch International, AUR, Gemini, Warner Brothers, and Eroica Records. His performances have been featured on NPR's Performance Today, BBC Radio 3, and CBC/Radio-Canada, reaching audiences worldwide.

Hauser holds degrees from the University of Michigan, Oberlin Conservatory, Rice University, and Michigan State University, and studied with oboists Daniel Stolper, James Caldwell, Robert Atherholt, Alex Klein, Mark Dubois and Robert Sorton. He also studied jazz improvisation with Jeff Coffin and Paul Hanson.
