

2025 Online Student Satisfaction Survey

May 3, 2025

Summary

Ball State's student satisfaction survey was distributed during the Spring 2025 semester. Of the anonymous responses, 587 students self-identified as "100% online student enrolled in an online program." This report is a summary of those student responses.


The survey was designed by administrative and support staff in the Division of Online and Strategic Learning. Topics include online course engagement, satisfaction, and preferences, as well as the various challenges faced by our students.

Insights from the survey include:

- *86% of online students are working full-time (30+ hours a week), while 43% are working more than 40 hours a week
- * Online students "strongly prefer" online asynchronous courses over other modalities
- 65% of online students "agree" or "strongly agree" that the amount of coursework is appropriate
- 68% of online students "agree" or "strongly agree" that they are satisfied with their online instructors
- The most common challenges include exhaustion or fatigue, work responsibilities, motivation to complete schoolwork, financial hardship, and mental health


Rate how much you agree with the following statements about your academic advisor:


During Spring 2025, which of the following has challenged you as a student...





"The amount of weekly coursework in my online courses is appropriate."




"I am satisfied with my online instructor(s)."
