Thanks to our wonderful program supporters, we were able to fill 45 boxes for students to receive food, winter, and household items along with gift cards in their winter break boxes. LETTTER FROM THE PROGRAM MANAGER

As we head into the holiday break from classes, I want to take a minute to reflect on the semester. The Guardian Scholars supported over 40 students, not including eligible non-participants. Eight students received financial support through program scholarships and six requested textbook assistance. There were 22 visits to our Take What You Need Closet with the average visitor receiving 5 hygiene items per visit. Students received school supplies like notebooks, folders, pens, highlighters, and calendars/planners from our office. A Sleep Seminar was hosted for those struggling with sleep rhythms. A Thanksgiving meal was shared and Winter Break Boxes capped off the semester to help fill gaps in between terms.

Does all this make a difference? The answer is YES! Whether or not that impact can be measured in academic achievement depends on the student. But students leave our office having received the highest level of individualized support available at the University. Some days encouragement and celebration are in order and other moments require students to receive hard truths about their circumstances. It is the great honor of my work to get to be a part of these student's lives as they navigate the complexities of college and their individual lives.

TEXTBOOK ASSISTANCE

We introduced textbook assistance this semester with funding through the Women of Beneficence grant. In total we fielded six textbook assistance requests. The average amount requested was \$430, with requests ranging from \$295 to \$670. We awarded a total of \$2,456 in textbook assistance for the Fall Semester.
