6 Say hello to Frog Baby

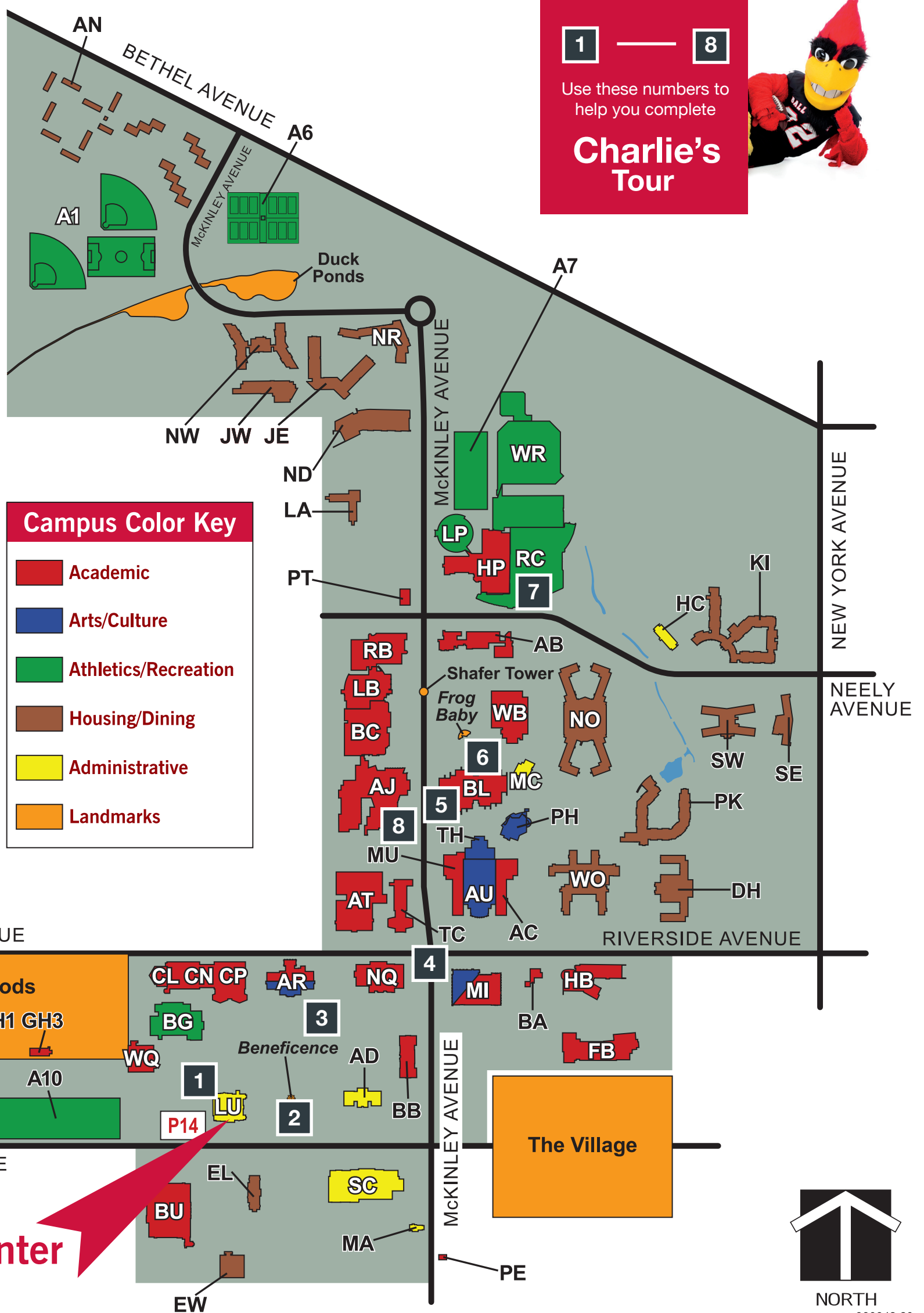
