1 Begin at Lucina Hall

Lucina Hall is a first-stop location for many new students seeking undergraduate degrees. It was originally constructed as a women's dormitory but was converted to office space in the 1970s.

2 Stroll through Christy Woods

Christy Woods is an outdoor teaching laboratory for Ball State students, as well as the community. Located on the southwest corner of our campus, Christy Woods is a 17-acre property filled with mature deciduous forest, tall grass prairie, and other plant communities.

3 Admire the view at DOMA

Located within the Fine Arts Building, cultivates lifelong learning and recreation in the visual arts through its collection of original works of art, engaging exhibitions, and educational programs for the university community and other diverse audiences.

4 Take a break at Bookmark Cafe

Located on the first floor of Bracken Library, Bookmark Café offers a selection of locally brewed Hubbard & Ravens coffees, snacks, and quick meal options. A small seating area with bar tables and wall-mounted TV are available for eating inside the café or food and drinks purchased here can be consumed on any one of the library's four floors.

5 Try out The Whisper Wall

In between Bracken Library and the Whiting Business Building, bring a friend to test your hearing on the curved wall there.

6 Relax on the University Green

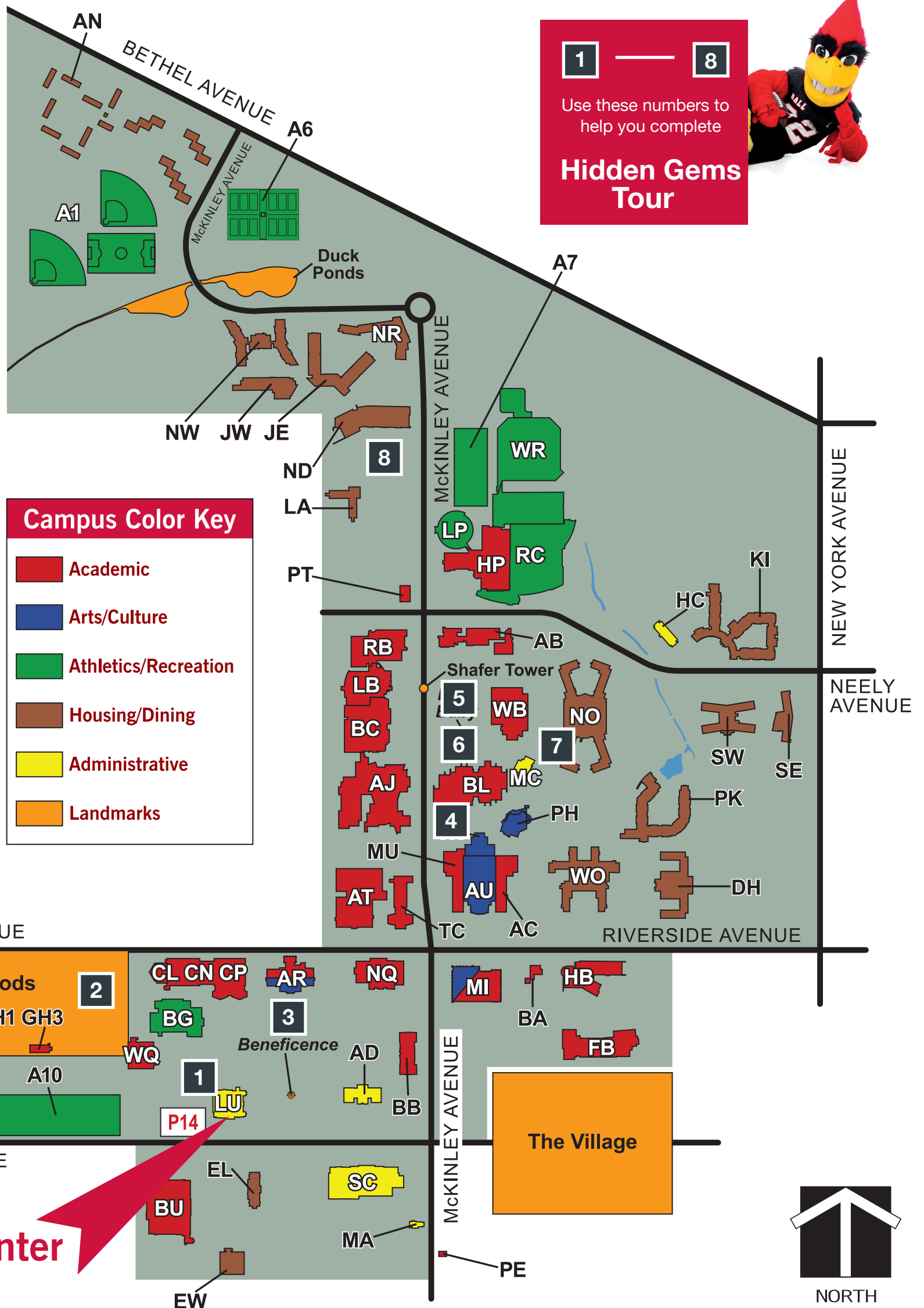
Located between Bracken Library and the Architecture Building, University Green is a popular spot for outdoor concerts and other special events.

7 Check out the Multicultural Center

The new Multicultural Center is at the heart of campus. The approximately 10,500-square-foot facility will contain open collaboration space for student organizations and peer advocate leaders; multipurpose rooms, and other functions; administrative offices; exhibition space for cultural art work that represent the values of inclusive excellence; and a small café.
