



## Master of Urban and Regional Planning, Fast-Track

Minimum requirement—36 graduate-level credits

The fast-track master of urban and regional planning (MURP) degree is open only to students who hold an undergraduate degree in planning from a school that is accredited by the American Planning Association.

Applicants must meet the admission requirements of the Graduate School and be approved by the Department of Urban Planning. International students must also meet the financial, English language, U.S. immigration (visa), and transcript certification requirements of the Rinker Center for International Programs (RCIP).

The curriculum is comprised of a common core of knowledge that is essential to planning and allied electives available in planning and other fields.

Electives may include Introductory and Advanced GIS for Urban Planning, Introduction to Multiculturalism as a Planning Context, International Planning, Grant Procurement and Administration for Planners, Urban Environmental Planning, and others. One elective must be a 600-level course unless the 6-hour thesis is selected. All CAP courses can count toward the elective requirements; get permission from your advisor if you plan to take courses outside of the college. If you did not take planning law as an undergraduate student, you are required to take it for this master's program.

## Accreditation

Our urban planning program is the only accredited program of its kind in Indiana.

The Planning Accreditation Board first accredited the bachelor's of urban planning and development (BUPD) as a five-year program in January 1995. In 2002, it was reaccredited as a four-year program. Accredited bachelor's programs are relatively unusual with only 16 in the nation. Our master's program was first accredited in January 1993 and has been reaccredited successively since that year.

Every few years the accreditation board visits to reassess our programs. Spring 2017 was the last such visit, and at that time, both programs were reaccredited until Dec. 31, 2022.

As the only accredited urban planning program in Indiana, we will teach you the skills you need to excel in the industry. Our supportive, expert faculty advance the latest theories and approaches through a blend of relevant classroom instruction paired with internships, field trips, and hands-on partnerships.
