### **WGS Core:**

#### **WGS 210**

##### **Introduction to Women's and Gender Studies**

CRN 31722 \*Sec 800\* Online, Full Summer Term (Jarrett)

CRN 31723 \*Sec 801\* Online, Full Summer Term (Jarrett)

CRN 33509 \*Sec 802\* Online, First Summer Term (Ellefson)

An introduction to Women's and Gender Studies, an interdisciplinary field focused on the ways that sex and gender manifest themselves in social, cultural, and political contexts. Discuss critical questions and concepts feminist scholars have developed as tools for thinking about gendered experience.

#### **WGS 220**

##### **International Women's Issues**

CRN 31724 \*Sec 800\* Online, Full Summer Term (Rosser)

Introduction to international women's studies issues.

Woman-centered interdisciplinary investigation into women's experiences in non-Western culture. Emphasis on contemporary issues framed by historical context.

#### **ENG 490**

##### **Literature and Gender**

CRN 35528 \*Sec 1\* MTWRF 9:15-10:50am, First Summer Term (Ferguson)

Study of gender and sexuality as understood, constructed, and contested in one or more cultural/historical settings. Texts may include literary, critical, and theoretical writings and works in other media.

### **Social and biological sciences electives:**

#### **CJC 211**

##### **Race, Ethnicity, and Gender**

CRN 36848 \*Sec 810\* Online, First Summer Term (Warren-Gordon)

Examination of racial, ethnic, and gender issues regarding criminal offenders, victims of crime, and employees of the criminal justice system.

\*Prerequisite: CJC 101 and 102. Open only to CJC majors and minors.

#### **CJC 332**

##### **Victimology**

CRN 31244 \*Sec 810\* Online, First Summer Term (Warren-Gordon)

Examining the correlation of victimization and victimization theories. Also examines victims' reactions and various responses made to victims by the criminal justice system and other societal agencies.

\*Prerequisite: CJC 101 and 102. Open only to CJC majors and minors.

## **CJC 410**

### **Violence Against Women**

CRN 36850 \*Sec 821\* Online, Second Summer Term  
(Warren-Gordon)

Examines current issues and responses to the problem of gender-based violence. Focus on the topics of rape/sexual assault, intimate partner violence, stalking, sexual harassment, and human trafficking. Discussion of ongoing controversies about the causes and effects of such violence against women. Examine the psychological, legal, sociological, and political discourses surrounding these issues using a feminist theorist approach.

\*Prerequisite: CJC 101 and 102. Open only to CJC majors and minors.

### **Health, Sex, & Family Life**

CRN 30657 \*Sec 800\* Online, Full Summer Term (Kotecki)  
CRN 32757 \*Sec 810\* Online, First Summer Term (Wood)  
CRN 37022 \*Sec 820\* Online, Second Summer Term  
(Mullins)

Health aspects of human sexuality and family life with a focus on human reproduction, physiology of sexual response, sexual disorders and dysfunctions, sexually transmitted diseases, promotion of sexual health, and the family's role in sex education.

## **HSC 372**

### **Women and Health**

CRN 36445 \*Sec 800\* Online, Full Summer Term (Jones)  
General overview of issues related to women and health: health needs of working women, special nutritional concerns, the gynecological exam, reproductive anatomy and physiology, fertility and infertility, breast problems, wife abuse, and rape.

## **SOC 235**

### **Sociology of Gender**

CRN 31696 \*Sec 800\* Online, Full Summer Term (Kraus)  
Examines women's and men's roles in society. Explores how gender intersects with a variety of social institutions including: race, class, religion, the economy, and politics.

## **SOC 424**

### **Family**

CRN 31703 \*Sec 800\* Online, Full Summer Term  
(Holtzman)

Advanced topics in the sociology of the family.

\*Prerequisite: SOC 100 plus 6 SOC hours, or permission of the instructor.

## **SOCW 250**

### **Human Behavior and the Social Environment 1**

CRN 35753 \*Sec 800\* Online, Full Summer Term  
(Newman)

Focuses on human growth and development from the prenatal period through later adulthood. Biological, psychological, and social aspects of human behavior are discussed. The complex interaction between human development and various social, cultural, spiritual, familial, organizational, and community factors are highlighted. Emphasizes applying concepts and theories to assessment. \*Prerequisite: SOCW 100 or permission of the department chairperson. Open only to social work majors and minors, and women and gender studies majors and minors.
